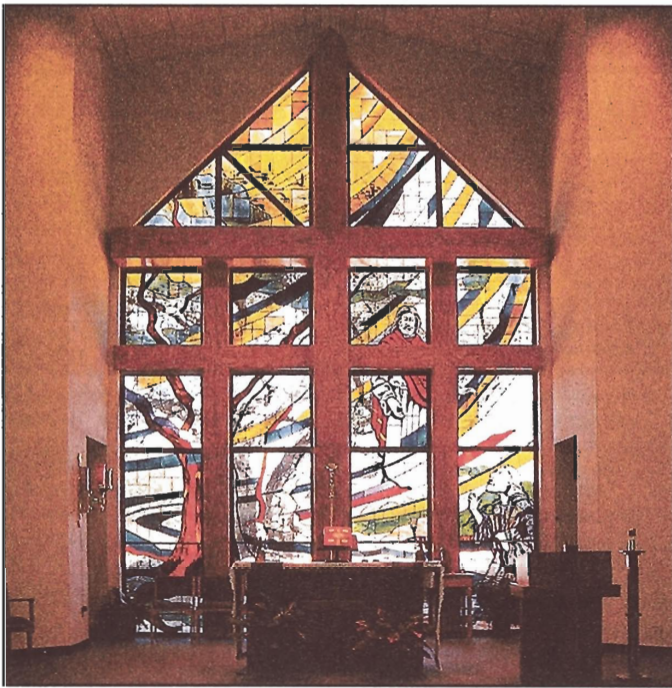

"We mortals witness divine glory in nature, in the order of things, in the beauty surrounding us, in the creation of our bodies, soul and intellect. God gives us the sky and the landscapes, the body and the spirit as gifts. Just He gave us Jesus, His son. The glory of God is present in all.

Human glory, being held in high esteem among others for our character, good works, position, etc., is a positive motivator for us. With the humble recognition that God is the source of our achievements, His glory shines through in our gratitude, our thankfulness. Why did God put these words and thoughts in my heart? What purpose will come from reflecting on them? Glory—the divinity of God. Thankfulness—my bended knee. Perhaps it is simply so I can give hope to others as a good steward of all that God has given me. There is little in the news about being thankful. We hear of and are affected by job losses, war, terrorist threats, and the injuries human beings impose on each other. Our fears rise and our hopes diminish.

But when we place ourselves humbly in the glory of God, our fears diminish. When we kneel in thankfulness for the gifts we have received our hopes tend to rise. With God as our source, our manna, our truth, we are equipped with everything we need to be His face and hands and feet to serve others; to be part of His glory in a spirit of thankfulness."

Marriage Preparation

Couples planning to marry should contact their priest or deacon at least six months prior to their wedding date in order to begin the marriage preparation process. Engaged couples are encouraged to inquire at their parish about pre-marriage retreats and classes. Couples planning to attend the diocesan pre-marriage retreat "Together in God's Image," are encouraged to register as soon as possible. The program will be offered in retreat format October 30-November 1 at Cedarbrake Catholic Retreat Center in Belton. There are a limited number of spaces, so those interested, should register as soon as possible.

Engaged couples must provide proof that they have taken the FOCCUS or PREPARE assessment before attending the "Together in God's Image" classes or retreat. October is Respect Life Month

Pope Benedict encourages us to be clear in our beliefs, act consistently with them, and be animated in our efforts to transform our culture. "The proclamation of life, life in abundance, must be the heart of the new evangelization," said Pope Benedict in his homily at St. Patrick's Cathedral. "For true life----our salvation----can only be found in the reconciliation, freedom and love which are God's gracious gift." Therefore, he continued: "The Church...is called to proclaim the gift of life, to serve life, and to promote a culture of life.... This is the message of hope we are called to proclaim and embody in a world where self-centeredness, greed, violence, and cynicism so often seem to choke the fragile growth of grace in people's hearts."

Our Holy Father urged us to let our daily prayer to the Father--- "Thy Kingdom come!"----bear fruit in the way we lead our lives and build up our families and communities. He added, "Praying fervently for the coming of the Kingdom... means overcoming every separation between faith and life, and countering false gospels of freedom and happiness. It also means rejecting a false dichotomy between faith and political life." Through the sacraments and meditative prayer, we can rediscover the truth and joy of Christian life fully lived for God and for others. By letting the love of Jesus Christ permeate our lives and actions in defense of our vulnerable brothers and sisters, we can transform our nation, building a culture where all people can again hope and trust in life!
